- 1 IAT course (excluding IAT 208 and 244)
- one additional course from IAT / CMPT / CMNS / FPA / TECH

SIAT reviews applications three times per year and the application deadlines are as follows:

- Spring: February 15
- Summer: June 15
- Fall: October 15
